01. The above compulsory subjects are offered by level.
A placement test is taken at the time of admission, so you can study in a class at the level that suits you.
02. In addition to compulsory subjects, there are also elective subjects (such as EJU preparation).
03. In addition to Japanese language classes, we also offer “Lifestyle Guidance” to learn about Japanese etiquette, visa renewal, part-time jobs, etc., “Carrier Path Guidance” to learn about entering higher education and taking entrance exams, and “Extracurricular Learning” to experience traditional performing arts and visit zoos and art museums. So you can have a fulfilling school life.

About entering Takarazuka University of Medical and Health Care

Takarazuka University of Medical and Health Care is a four-year university with three faculties and seven departments. If students who complete the Japanese Language Program for International Students proceed to Takarazuka University of Medical and Health Care, the admission fee will be exempted.

- * Our University will be implementing a quarter system from the April 2024 term, and students whose Certificate of Eligibility has been significantly delayed may be placed on courses other than those listed above.
- * The tuition fees are inclusive of taxes.
* The service charge of international transfers will be the responsibility of the applicant.
* If a service charge is deducted from the transferred amount, please make the payment to the school upon arrival.

Tuition Reduction

There is a system for reducing the entrance fee for the Japanese Language Program for International Students, Takarazuka University of Medical and Health Care.

1. If you have passed the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N2 or above (or passed the Japanese NAT-TEST Level 2 or above) at the time of application, you will be exempt from the full admission fee.
2. If you have passed the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N3 (or passed the Japanese NAT-TEST Level 3) at the time of application, you will be exempt from half of the admission fee.

National Health Insurance (NHI)

All residents of Japan are required to enroll in the NHI scheme. When receiving treatment at a hospital, 70% of the cost is paid by insurance and the remaining 30% is borne by the individual. (NHI premium for the first year after coming to Japan: Approximately 2,000 yen per months)
